What Wildlife Have You Seen?

"I was coming down the hill on Sweetgrass Drive heading North. It was misting - low cloud cover and fog rolling in. Then I heard it, the distinctive high pitched whistle, "teeteeeeeet." A Broad winged hawk! It was above me, in the fog - invisible, obviously circling. Then I heard it again, then another - there were two. I stopped between the two bridges between Brodie Creek and Payne Branch on the west side of Sweetgrass adjacent to the specimen Green Ash Tree. There I saw the pair, perched about 30' high in the tree, I observed them for 20 minutes. What a sight!"

Broad-winged hawks are small with short pointed wings and three notched outer feathers. The tail is dark gray to black with broad white stripes across the middle and two smaller

stripes at the tip. They are 13-17 inches long, have a 3 foot wing span, and weigh 11-17 ounces.

Broad-winged hawks breed throughout the eastern U.S. and most of southern Canada between April and August. They like openings such as roads, trails, and wetlands for nesting.

Broad-winged hawks are monogamous. They build nests 25-40 feet high in the lower third of a tree, or use another birds nest.

The female usually lays 2 to 3 eggs usually white, pale cream, or bluish. Incubation is 28 to 31 days.

Broad-winged hawks winter habitat include southern Florida, southern Mexico, Central America and northern South America. They migrate in flocks, called kettles, which can number tens of thousands.

Broad-winged hawks are carnivores and they hunt from a perch. Their diet changes seasonally - ranging from in-

sects to mammals. Their lifespan is 12 years.

The global population of broad-winged hawks is estimated to be about 1,800,000 individuals. They are considered quite common in North America and are protected by state and federal law.

- **DO NOT** cut, plant anything or dump clippings or trash in the greenspace behind your lot. You may trim the weeds up to two (2) feet behind your lot line. **DO NOT REMOVE** any trees!
